

Promising Practice Award

Promising Practices are exciting approaches and strategies to local public health issues. Each awarded practice was reviewed by a committee of peers, made up of other local health department professionals. Each award was selected from a competitive collection of applications.





This year TRPHD was awarded a promising practice award for opioid and overdose prevention. TRPHD has been visiting licensed liquor establishments, discussing overdose prevention, distributing Naloxone (Narcan), and creating educational materials explaining the signs of an overdose and where to get Narcan in the area at no cost.

Additionally, TRPHD has been visiting district Senior Centers to provide information about using lock boxes to secure medications for community safety.
