One effective tip is to use timers to motivate kids to brush for the appropriate duration. See more tips below:

- Schedule routine check-ups.
- Clean your baby's gums daily.
- Start brushing with the first tooth.
- Brush twice each day for two minutes.
- Begin flossing.
- Snack healthy!
- Keep them hydrated! Avoid sugary drinks and stick to good old-fashioned water.

Part of Two Rivers Environmental Health education is RADON. TRPHD's dedicated Environmental Health team, Ashley Green, and Adam Viar took to the public and distributed nearly 200 radon test kits.

- In Nebraska, homes are at high risk for radon due to a lot of naturally occurring uranium.
- Radon levels can vary widely from house to house, even if they are right next to each other.
- The lowest levels of the home often have the highest levels of radon, including basements and crawlspaces.
- Counties with Highest Average
 Radon Levels
- #1 Franklin (Average= 6.0-6.7)
- #2 Phelps (Average= 5.2-5.7)
- #3 Harlan (Average= 5.2-5.7)
